Course Content: This is a course in mathematical problem solving and written communication. We will focus on the mathematical problem-solving techniques specifically necessary for the annual William Lowell Putnam Mathematical Competition (for further information on the exam consult the course web site). The material we cover will be wide-ranging, thought-provoking, and hopefully a little bit fun, too.

Homework: Homework will be assigned every Monday. Assignments will take the form of takehome "quizzes" designed to model the actual Putnam Competition itself. You will be required to submit a carefully written solution to at least one problem each week. The quality of your mathematical exposition will be considered to be just as important as the correctness of your solution(s). Each assignment will carry equal weight toward the homework component of your grade.

Attendance: Weekly attendance in the seminar is encouraged, but roll will not be taken. Nonetheless, excessive absences should be explained to me. You are also **required** to attend both the morning and afternoon sessions of the Putnam Competition on December 3. Failure to attend the Putnam Competition will automartically result in a grade of F.

Grades: Your grade in this course will be determined as follows:

As noted above, failure to attend the Putnam Competition will result in an automatic F.

Calculators: You may feel free to use a calculator or computer while solving homework problems, but strictly speaking neither will be necessary. Be aware that calculators will **not** be permitted during the Putnam Competition itself.
